Care Instructions for Skin Areas Treated with Liquid Nitrogen

- 1. Leave the treated areas uncovered unless otherwise specified by your physician or nurse. It is fine to wear clothing over any treated areas.
- 2. The areas treated may be slightly red and swollen for the first 24 to 48 hours.
- 3. A small blister may form on the areas treated. No treatment is needed.
- 4. You may take Tylenol or Aspirin as needed for pain.
- 5. Protect any treated areas that are sun exposed with a sunscreen SPF 30 or higher.
- 6. It may take anywhere from 2 to 4 weeks for the areas treated to form a scab and fall off.
- 7. Be sure to keep and scheduled followed up appointments with your physician.
- 8. Be patient. It may take more than 1 treatment for the areas treated to completely go away.
- 9. The area may heal with color changes (darkening or lightening) in the treated area this is known as hyper or hypo-pigmentation. This may be permanent. Regular sunscreen use may lessen the risk of hyper-pigmentation.
